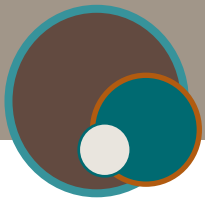

Leadership Message

What a year it has been at the Oregon Lions Sight & Hearing Foundation: We broke program records, reached new milestones in service and nearly completed our capital campaign in one year! We are pleased to present this annual report and summarize some of the highlights of this amazing year.

Who would have believed back in 1994 when we launched the Mobile Health Screening Program that we would surpass 409,000 people screened in that program. This year alone, we screened over 37,000 people—a new record by far. We also broke records in Patient Care and Mission Cataract thanks to the generous contribution of free surgeries by EyeHealth NW and many others. KATU TV did a story about Mission Cataract this year that highlights OLSHF and Lions as “Everyday Heroes.” To see this video, visit our website at www.OLSHF.org.

The new car on the cover is a symbol of our success this year in our 2020 Vision capital campaign to transform the screening program. In just 12 months, OLSHF received commitments of over \$507,000 to reach 82% of our goal. Soon, we will have a fleet of new cars and 12 portable kits delivering screening to twice as many children! With Lions Clubs and individual gifts, we hope to complete the campaign by the end of 2012.

Based on our success with legislation last year, we now have over 2,000 used glasses in a library and database ready for distribution in Oregon. And stay tuned because soon we hope to be working to help manufacture new glasses at highly discounted rates. For the first time, this year, OLSHF received dedicated funds for the Low Vision Clinic. We also distributed over 400 hearing aids to people in need free of charge. Our 3rd Annual Patient Care Breakfast attracted nearly 200 guests becoming our biggest fundraising event of the year. Despite the difficult economy, we will end the year in the black, as we continue to move from “Good to Great.” We could not do this without over 4,000 Lions volunteers. Thank you for all of your support that makes our work possible.

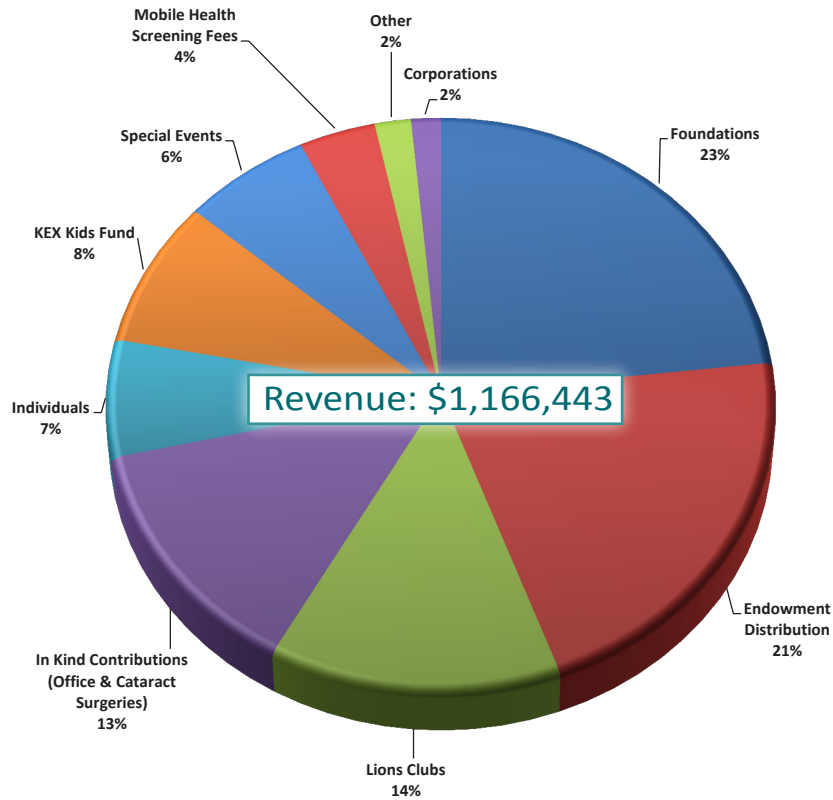

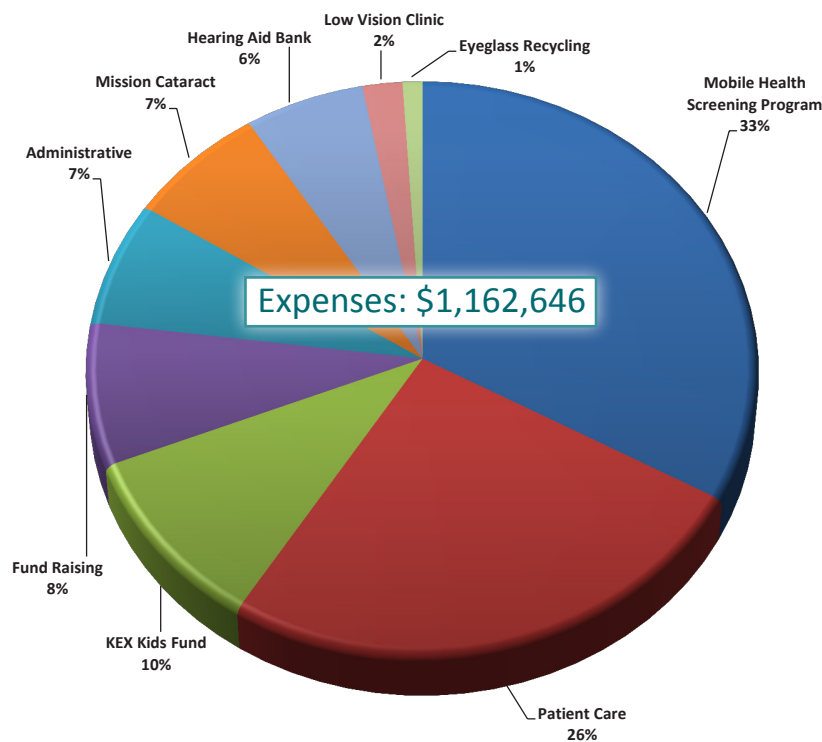

2020 Vision: Screen More Children

The Next Generation of Mobile Health Screening

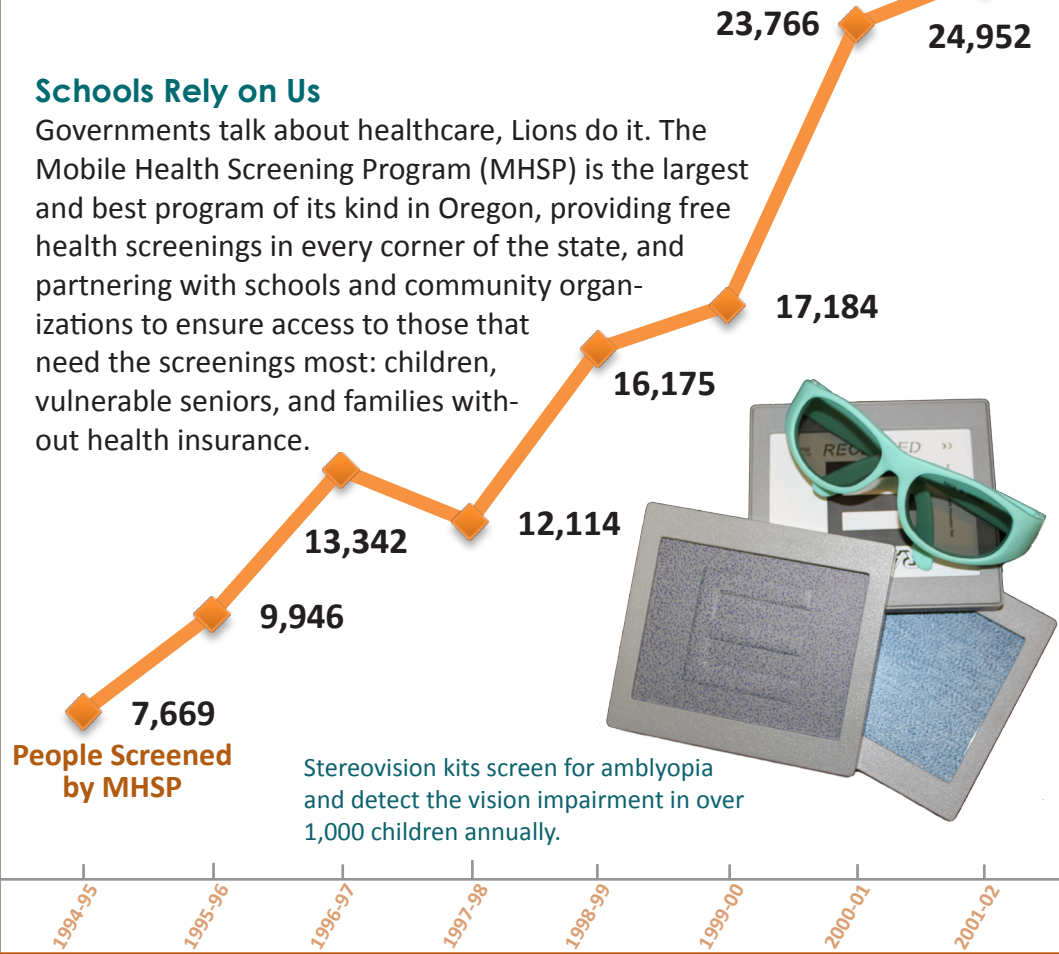
Most of us assume schools are getting the job done...

In fact, the State of Oregon requires sight and hearing screenings for students but not all schools can afford it. Oregon ranks 42nd, near the bottom in school nurses. Fifty-four of 200 school districts do not have school nurses and about half of all districts do not meet the recommended nurse-to-student ratio. We help fill the gap. Since 1994, the Oregon Lions Sight & Hearing Foundation (OLSHF) has provided screenings throughout the state, now testing over 30,000 children each year. But this only accounts for 15% of school children in recommended K, 1st, 3rd and 5th grades. Our goal is to screen two to three times more children.

Studies show that vision problems affect 1 in 4 school children. Since most early learning is visually based, the risk runs high of a child falling behind quickly if problems are not addressed. Undetected vision impairment can lead to a range of limitations for a child and at worst, permanent loss of sight. OLSHF refers about 17% of children screened for further medical examination.

Schools Rely on Us

Governments talk about healthcare, Lions do it. The Mobile Health Screening Program (MHSP) is the largest and best program of its kind in Oregon, providing free health screenings in every corner of the state, and partnering with schools and community organizations to ensure access to those that need the screenings most: children, vulnerable seniors, and families without health insurance.

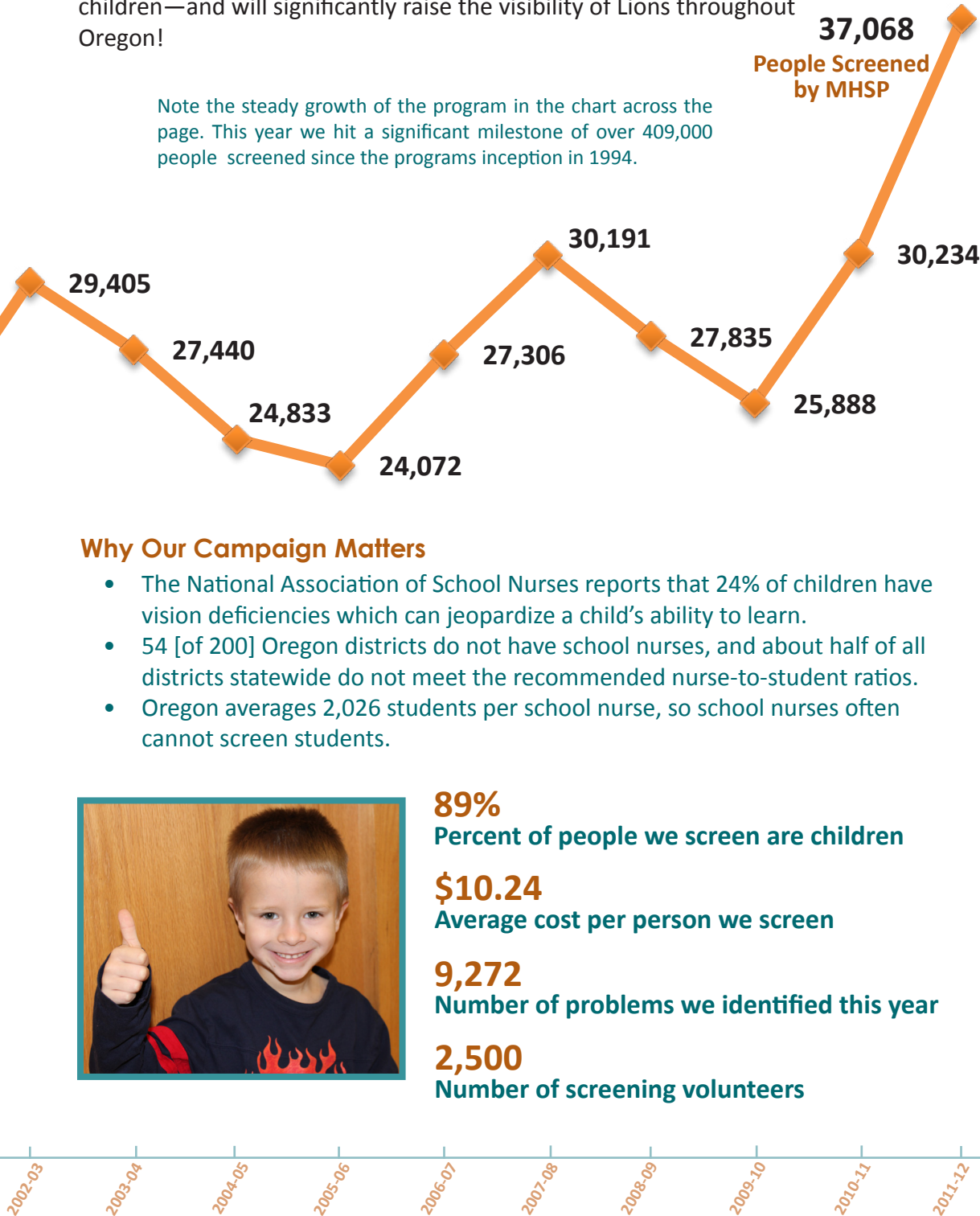

Our 2020 Vision Capital Campaign

Our \$615,000 2020 Vision Campaign—now 82% complete—will enable us to screen more children than ever. Our vision is for all Oregon students in grades K, 1st, 3rd and 5th to receive sight and hearing screening annually. This will prevent serious health problems and improve academic performance for thousands of our children—and will significantly raise the visibility of Lions throughout Oregon!

Note the steady growth of the program in the chart across the page. This year we hit a significant milestone of over 409,000 people screened since the programs inception in 1994.



Why Our Campaign Matters

- The National Association of School Nurses reports that 24% of children have vision deficiencies which can jeopardize a child's ability to learn.
- 54 [of 200] Oregon districts do not have school nurses, and about half of all districts statewide do not meet the recommended nurse-to-student ratios.
- Oregon averages 2,026 students per school nurse, so school nurses often cannot screen students.

Patient Care Surgeries Change Lives

Donna Roberts, 58, tried to volunteer at a wild life sanctuary in spite of being nearly blind by cataracts. Her severe vision impairment was a safety hazard and Donna could not work with the big cats she adores. However, a few weeks after her free surgery through Mission Cataract, Donna returned to the sanctuary and was allowed to handle a lynx and a 15-week-old tiger cub. Now she plans to become a regular volunteer.

“I cried as I held the cats, overwhelmed by their beautiful, bold colors...colors that had faded long ago for me. I was desperate and hopeless and you gave me back a life I thought I had lost. What a miracle! I will be forever grateful,” Donna said.

Engracia Sonato, 52, was frightened when she realized she was slowly losing her vision. It was more than being unable to work as a seasonal fruit picker or to cook for her family. She literally feared for her life. Engracia’s mom died in Mexico wishing she could afford cataract surgery. Blinded by the “clouds” obscuring her vision, complications from a serious fall eventually led to her death. Engracia was certain the same fate awaited her and she fell into a state of depression and despair.

Engracia said, “I had lost hope. I just kept wondering if my life would end like my mother’s. Thanks to your organization and the generous doctors, I got the cataract surgery I could never afford. I’m back to work and every day I’m thankful for this blessing.”

Partners Changing Lives

Our new Mission Cataract Oregon program has grown tremendously this year. Participating ophthalmologists generously provide free cataract surgeries to qualified individuals in need, including exams, surgery facilities, anesthesia, intraocular lenses, medication and follow-up care valued at an average of \$6,700 per eye.

This statewide program helped 63 individuals this year with total services valued at \$422,100. These partnerships enable us to redirect savings to fund other surgeries and treatments through the Patient Care Program. Because of this, 258 people have received surgeries this year, breaking an all time record.

The team of doctors at **EyeHealth Northwest** alone impacted the lives of 47 people who were losing their vision to cataracts. **Dr. Martin Balish** of Oregon Eye Specialists and his team performed back-to-back surgeries on eight individuals. “This is a local mission where we are helping people in need in our own communities,” said Dr. Balish. We are also grateful to **Dr. Douglas Merritt** in Grants Pass and **Dr. Matthew Neale** in Eugene who joined the Mission Cataract team of doctors this year. Having partners in these areas of the state decreases the travel burden and facilitates follow-up care of patients.

The Mission Cataract program has done more than restore the sight of individuals who long to be productive members of society or see their grandchildren, it has even saved lives. During pre-op for several patients, dangerously high blood pressure or blood sugar levels were discovered. With our Mission Cataract partners, the Foundation has helped patients stabilize serious health risks and changed lives.

LERC Takes a LEAP

Can you read this: Your LEAP is OLSHF’s newest effort through our LCI LERC. Does that make any sense? How about: Your **Lions Eyeglass Assistance Program** is the **Oregon Lions Sight & Hearing Foundation’s** newest effort through our **Lions Clubs International Lions Eyeglass Recycling Center**.

Either way, it’s big news! If you review the impact report on page 11, you will see that our Eyeglass Recycling Program helps twice as many people as any other OLSHF program—over 65,000—for about 28 cents per person. Over the last six months, OLSHF has built a database and library of approximately 2,000 pairs of used single vision eyeglasses for distribution here in Oregon. We are working with Lions Clubs and providers to search the database for prescription matches. If someone in your community 1) has a valid prescription for single vision eyeglasses, and 2) is living at less than 200% of the federal poverty level, contact Programs Manager Kerith Vance. At a recent meeting for LCI’s official LERCs, we learned about opportunities to manufacture new eyeglasses using what’s being called the “Lions Lens.” Stay tuned for more details in October as OLSHF continues to look for new ways to provide eyewear to people in need!

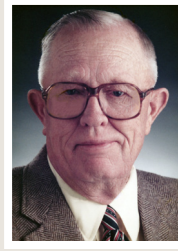

Saturday, August 4th at the Willamette Valley Country Club in Canby, Oregon**

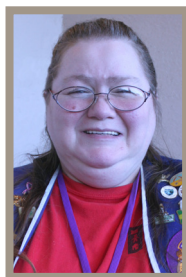

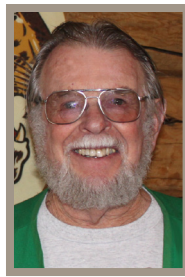

Volunteers Make it Happen

It is a well known fact that volunteers make the world go round. Every year, OLSHF depends on thousands of dedicated individuals and Lions Clubs who generously give of their time and resources, enabling us to help more people.

To celebrate and recognize the extraordinary volunteers who have gone above and beyond the call of duty to support our work, OLSHF awarded Volunteers of the Year Awards to the above Lions. We salute every volunteer and send our sincerest gratitude for helping us fulfill our mission of improving the quality of life of the most vulnerable members of our community.

Patient Care Breakfast Fundraiser

Our 3rd Annual Patient Care Breakfast raised over \$60,000 for critical sight and hearing saving surgery and treatment on May 3rd at the Oregon Zoo. We're extremely grateful for the generous \$20,000 challenge grant from the Joseph F. Weston Public Foundation—Thanks Joe!—and for the attendance of nearly 200 participants at the event.

We were able to catch up with 12 yr. old Jeremiah Wolter and his mom, Lorelee, at the event as Jeremiah shared with the audience his appreciation for receiving his cochlear implant when he was just 18 months old. Lorelee expressed her gratitude as well: "You have no idea how helpless we felt when we were first told that Jeremiah couldn't hear... but then the Lions were there for us. We'll always be grateful for the Oregon Lions Sight & Hearing Foundation."

Kim Tate, recipient of double cataract surgery, shared how her restored sight kept her family together. Kim faced the prospect of having to give up caring for her 3-year-old grandson while his mom served in the military. Now she has started a new life where she will soon be employed by the Federal government. Her youngest daughter, Brittany, also shared a poem she wrote that deeply moved the audience and said in part:

"And when we felt there was no hope, a new light shined down, like an angel from above. A gift that could only come from love. The friendly Lion came to carry us through... And all I can think to say is 'Thank you...' My Mom could once again see.
All that darkness had been turned to light, all thanks to your gift of sight."

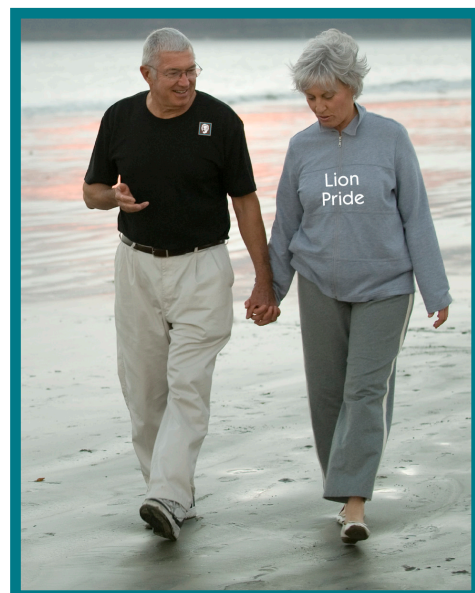
